York County's students of today will turn into the finest adults of tomorrow. York County is a great place to raise a family...and thanks to a first-rate school system and extra-curricular activities, York County is an even better place to be a kid.

York County Child Care

In this economic climate, the luxury of a stay-at-home parent is a memory of the past for most families. According to the United Way Program, Focus on Our Future, over 65% of York County Children under the age of six have both parents working outside the home. With two working parents, young children will be likely to spend at least 45 hours each week with a day care provider. Finding the right childcare for your child and your family is a critical decision — but York County provides an abundance of options.

Pennsylvania is a national leader in early childhood learning and development. The general philosophy embraced by the Commonwealth is that learning begins right away and education is the best start for your child's overall success. There are several things to consider when reviewing daycare providers — quality, safety, location and cost are just a few. There are several resources available to parents looking for quality childcare in York County.

Many searches begin with government organizations such as the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare (DPW). DPW

certifies centers that meet safety requirements. In addition, the DPW has also launched the Keystone STARS program. Centers that apply for and obtain Keystone STARS are places that meet safety requirements and excel in the early education of children as well. Keystone STARS (Standards, Training/Professional Development, Assistance, Resources) identify centers with one through four STARS, depending on the early education requirements that are met.

If you are concerned about finding and affording quality childcare, Pennsylvania's Department of Public Welfare can help. The Child Care Works subsidized child care program assists working parents (who meet eligibility guidelines) with their expenses for the quality care provided for their children. Pre-K in York County: A Solid Foundation

Pennsylvania has written the book on Pre-K programs — as noted with their revolutionary "Pre-K Counts." "Pennsylvania Pre-K Counts, established by the Pennsylvania Department of Education, is bringing quality half-day and full-day pre-kindergarten to 11,800 three to four year olds in Pennsylvania."ⁱⁱⁱ Pre-K Counts is allowing at risk three- and four-year-old children to be enrolled in a state-funded, kindergarten readiness program.

In addition to Pre-K Counts, York residents can expect to take advantage of the many advancements available throughout Pennsylvania. Pre-K programs are available through local school districts, public and private nursery schools, child care facilities, Head Start Centers and local private schools and academies.

The Pennsylvania Department of Education offers Head Start Services for eligible

children in York County (as well as the rest of the state). Head Start program centers often act in collaboration with local school districts or registered and licensed child care centers. Through Head Start, pre-K aged children have access to a high-quality, "developmentally appropriate" program with full-day, 12-month and extended hour services. Head Start, a federally mandated program, not only provides a Pre-K education, but outlines a basic health program to include nutritional guidelines and medical check-up expectations.ⁱⁱⁱ

test scores. Additionally, two-thirds of high school seniors indicate that they plan to attend college or some form of post-secondary education.

One of the biggest advantages to being a Pennsylvania resident is the Accountability Block Grants (ABG). According to the Pennsylvania Department of Education, "The Pennsylvania Accountability Block Grant offers districts the start of a much-needed investment in proven programs and gives districts the flexibility to implement those programs that would best serve their individual needs." For York County residents — this means some of the best public school programs and districts in the country. Reduced class sizes, incentives for qualified teachers, high-quality tutoring programs and additional family resource networks are just some of the areas that school districts look to improve with the assistance of the ABG.

York County Private Schools: Academies and Beyond

York County also has a number of nonpublic options for elementary and secondary education, including a charter school in York, several private preparatory schools, parochial schools, and provisions for home schooling. Private and parochial schools have operated in the county since settlers first came to the region. Current offerings range from small, church-based facilities to larger schools with a full range of academic and extra-curricular offerings.

Charter Schools

Charter schools are public schools that operate independently of the local school districts. They apply for a charter through a granting agency, such as a school district, and once approved begin to develop a curriculum. Schools are established with a specific mission, program goals, assessment methods and students served (both need based and location specific). Initial charters typically last 3-5 years but may be renewed. Most Charter schools are sponsored by the state or local school boards and are held accountable to the promises made in the charter contract.

Cyber Schools

Pennsylvania is home to a different kind of Charter program — Cyber Schools. Cyber schools combine the academic standards and expectations of a bricks-and-mortar charter school with the latest, cutting edge technologies to form an "on demand" curriculum for its students. Families are

given the autonomy to "build" their own school to address their specific needs. Parents play a critical role in cyber schools as they work hand-in-hand with their child's teacher to encourage learning.

Home Schooling

Although there are a wide variety of excellent public, private and parochial options in York County, Pennsylvania also allows parents or legal guardians the option of schooling their children at home as a way of satisfying compulsory school attendance requirements. York County has an excellent support system for parents wishing to school their children at home. Through the York Home School Association (YHSA), parents have access to everything they need from local and state requirements, clubs for kids, parent support groups, class co-ops, play dates in the park and more. Home schooled students can participate in local sports and clubs through the YHSA, just like their traditionally-schooled counterparts. York County School of Technology

The York County School of Technology is available to home or institutionally schooled students beginning in 9th or 10th grade. Dedicated to working with students to best prepare them for future careers, York County School of Technology offers programs in the areas of Arts & Human Sciences, Engineering & Construction and Manufacturing & Transportation. 14 of York County's 16 school districts work with the YCST. The quality of a YCST education is unsurpassed. Technical training is combined with the necessary academic education found in non-technical schools. Students are encouraged to explore areas that will help them build skills such as problem-solving and team building, skills that will assist them to meet the needs of the business industry after they graduate from high school. YCST works with leaders in the local business industry to build their curriculum, ensuring success for their students' futures. addition to a solid academic base.

Beyond High School: Post-Secondary Education in York County

After high school, look no further than your backyard for quality and affordable continuing education for your teen. York

County is home to several reputable colleges and technical schools. You may even decide to go back to school yourself and enroll in an adult education program!

PENN STATE YORK

Internationally renowned Penn State maintains a campus in the greater York area, serving about 1,600 students. This commuter campus is situated on 51-acres and offers seven associate degrees, eight bachelor's degrees, six minors, one masters degree and the first two years of more than 160 Penn State baccalaureate majors. Penn State York offers students the feel and appeal of a small, private college while still being part of a major internationally known University, Penn State. Penn State York is one of the University's international campuses.

Students interested in getting first-hand information from other students can visit Penn State York's blog site to help answer the many questions of perspective students. Four students and two admissions counselors are using technology to reach out and talk about their Penn State York experiences. Ultimately, those involved with the blog recognize the importance of choosing the right college. The students and counselors use their own journey with Penn State York to help students find their right fit. In addition to the blog, the campus maintains a Web site, a Facebook page, and regularly sends out tweets in Twitter.

Penn State York is actively involved in community outreach and believes that partnering with the community is the best way to encourage the development of its students. Penn State York offers traditional undergraduate, graduate, and noncredit education for students of all ages. Looking beyond recent high school graduates, Penn State York also encourages ongoing adult education through its continuing education programs and workforce development efforts. The campus reaches out to businesses and manufacturers in the area to help train their workforces for the future. Programs are offered on campus as well as on-site at places of business throughout the community.


The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI at Penn State York), created in April 2008, continues to grow and is open to all adults who are looking to continue their education through life's experiences and learning. Courses are taught during the day by college faculty members, artists, school teachers, professionals and others who are all volunteers of the program.

OLLI is funded by a low yearly membership fee and a small per course fee; it is open to all adults who love to learn.

Penn State York continues its Bachelor of Science in Business (BSB) degree and credit certificates in business in Hanover. Partnering with Hanover HealthCare PLUS the classes are held at the Hanover Community Health & Education Center in Hanover. The BSB is for individuals who are seeking general preparation in business. A combination of theoretical studies of core business disciplines, management studies, marketing, finance, and logistics combine to create this comprehensive degree.

Penn State York campus boasts the state-of-the-art Lee R. Glatfelter Library, a contemporary and comfortable environment tucked within an artistic oasis. The library has two separate levels, which include group study rooms, instructional space, and a special conference room, computer labs, sitting areas and a coffee bar. This 20,000-square-foot library facility is more than double in size from 9,000 square feet in the old facility and features expansive windows that provide plenty of natural light while offering spectacular views of Memorial Park and the City of York. Classrooms are also located within this new facility in addition to various computer labs and

sitting areas. Perhaps the favorite gathering area is The Bistro, a coffee bar that is located on the first floor, just outside the library. The Pullo Family Performing Arts Center (The Pullo Center) combines arts with academics in addition to student services offering 1,028-seats in 71,000 square feet of space. This state-of-the art facility has become a destination for both students during the day and residents at night for shows. Its cutting-edge audio, video, data, and lighting systems plus fully adjustable acoustic curtaining to luxurious interior accoutrements makes it an ideal venue for nationally recognized shows to tech (test and build their sets and lighting) at the center. Thus, many national shows start their tours here before traveling throughout the country. Most importantly, this new facility offers opportunities for students to work hands-on in theatre production, sound, and lighting.

The campus' most recent project is the renovation of the old library building into the new Edward M. Elias Science Building which will open to students in the summer of 2010. The new science building is named in honor of the late Edward M. Elias, founder of Penn State York and former director of the campus for 35 years. The 15,000 square foot building contains two chemistry labs, one biology lab, a general purpose classroom, and chemistry and biology research spaces. These labs replace the original campus chemistry labs which were built in the 1960s and were originally located in the Main Classroom Building. The building was constructed with many energy saving features including: automatic/motion sensitive lights (lights turn on and off based on occupancy in a room), additional insulation to increase the R value of the walls, automatic flushers and faucets in the restrooms, and variable speed drives in the heating and cooling system to save energy. Additionally, members of the biology and chemistry faculty will have their offices in the building.

The new facility provides state-of-the-art lab and classroom resources to aid students pursuing the campus' popular four-year science degrees as well as degrees in other fields. The Starbucks Greenhouse, attached to the science building, continues to provide an excellent space for biology instruction and research.

Penn State York continues to offer a bachelor's degree in Nursing for those who are currently registered nurses (RNs). The program began in 2007 and prior to its start, nursing students were required to begin their general education requirements and prerequisites in York, and then travel

outside of York County to complete their degree. This exciting moves continues in response to the growing need for nurses to hold a bachelor's degree in the field. Penn State York also continues to offer a theatre minor which is designed to be an enhancement to a major area of study or personal enrichment. The minor should be particularly attractive to students in the humanities (English), communication (film, journalism), and the arts (music, architecture). Also in response to the growing need for highly skilled workers, Penn State York is a center for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Careers. Robots in the engineering labs, courses that offer hands-on experience, and connections to numerous business and industry leaders give Penn State York students the opportunity to prepare for the careers of tomorrow right here in York.

YORK COLLEGE OF PENNSYLVANIA

YORK COUNTY SCHOOL OF TECHNOLOGY

York County has several excellent programs for adults wishing to continue their education — and one of the most comprehensive vocational programs is based at the York County School of Technology. They provide a curriculum specialized for adults with the needs of nearby businesses in mind. York County employers work with program administrators to ensure that York residents are receiving the necessary training to be placed in York jobs. The Adult and Continuing Education program at the York County School of Technology offers more than 125 courses and also does on-site training. They also have an adult nursing program that trains a person to be a Licensed Nurse Practitioners through academics and clinical experience.

HACC

The Harrisburg Area Community College, or HACC, also has a York Campus. HACC is ideal for a student who is not yet ready for a 4-year college or university. Two-thirds of the students enrolled in HACC live with a spouse and/or their children, and most attend classes in addition to a full time job. HACC believes that education is crucial to professional success and they encourage adults to enroll in order to improve job skills and career training. Adult students are not the only people interested in HACC York. In fact, high school students can now earn college credits during their senior year through HACC. HACC offers more than 170 degree, certificate or diploma programs and even offers online or video classes.
